THANK YOU FOR YOUR ASSISTANCE ~

We greatly appreciate that parents review these rules with their children before they come to camp. Other policies and guidelines for Ski & Snowboard Camp will be outlined on the first day of camp, and as needed throughout the week.

- ☼ We appreciate that Ski & Snowboard Camp is very exciting ~ and a tremendous amount of fun! Part of what creates this atmosphere is the enthusiasm and energy of the campers. All campers must remember, however, that they are guests of Purity Spring Resort. We expect full respect for our property. Any damages that may occur as a result of overly rambunctious or vandalistic behavior will be appropriately charged to those responsible.
- ☼ We expect that all campers will respect each other's private property, personal space and identity. Campers are responsible for taking care of their own belongings. Touching other people's belongings without permission is absolutely inappropriate. Teasing, bullying and otherwise "mean" behaviors are simply not acceptable at Ski & Snowboard Camp. We ALL want to have fun!
- ☼ As explained in the "*Keeping the Kids Healthy*" section, we are very concerned about amount of "junk food" and soda that sometimes appears with kids at camp. Out of this concern, we do not want food and / or soda in dormitory rooms. Beyond basic nutrition, it has been repeatedly proven over the years that food in the rooms inevitably gets very messy. For every piece of candy consumed, another will be squished into the carpet. We reserve the right to confiscate any food and / or soda that we find in dormitory rooms.
- ☼ As explained in the "*Packing for Camp*" section, there are certain items we do not want to come with the kids to Ski & Snowboard Camp. Specifically, I am referring to certain pieces of technology that we feel distract from the camp experience we intend to provide for our campers. Any such items that become a disruption to the program, or to anyone else's experience, will be removed from the camper's possession and secured in the office safe, to be returned at the conclusion of camp. It would be better to simply leave all such items at home and trust that a good time can be had at camp without them.
- ☼ It must be made clear to all campers that alcoholic beverages, drugs (including marijuana), and cigarettes are not allowed at Ski & Snowboard Camp. Discovery of these items will be responded to with severity, including dismissal from camp. If this was to occur, it is expected that parents will support our efforts and make immediate arrangements for transportation.
- ☼ We are fortunate that our facilities rest on the shores of a beautiful private lake. This time of year, the lake is often frozen and might appear safe. There are spots on this lake, however, where the ice may be thin and therefore potentially dangerous. At no time should any camper be on the lake unless as part of an officially organized and supervised Ski & Snowboard Camp event.
- ☼ At the opening of camp, a representative from Ski Patrol will address the campers regarding "mountain etiquette". All campers and staff at camp ~ along with the rest of the population ~ are expected to abide by established mountain policies and behavior guidelines. Ski Patrol has the power to remove skiing / boarding privileges from anyone being disrespectful or disruptive on the mountain. Since Ski & Snowboard Camp is a lot more fun when skiing and snowboarding is part of the experience, we assume all campers will consistently utilize good judgment while enjoying the slopes of King Pine.
- ☼ Campers are expected to participate in all parts of the camp program. We expect that campers will attend all scheduled lessons, meals, and other camp program activities on time... and prepared to listen, learn, laugh and have fun!
