. *Sports Illustrated Next snow* search competition held at King Pine Ski Area on **1/29/06**. The winner and one parent will be sent to **Killington VT** to compete in the national finals on NBC. King Pine's contest consists of Jumps, rails, halfpipe and a Nastar type racecourse. It also includes style, attitude and personality.

The Sport Illustrated for Kids Next Snow Search is a quest to find the next generation of skiers and snowboarders. On February 3-5 2006 at Killington Resort will witness the best up-and-coming skiers and snowboarders from ski resorts across the nation competing in an all-mountain, all equipment snow sports event as they vie for the few spots on the nextsnow team. Athletes range from 9 to 13 years of age, boys and girls, skiers and riders and adaptive athletes. Unlike other snow sports competitions, participants here are judged not only on their on-snow performance, but on attitude and character as well. Big air and a big smile equals success. Events during the three days of competition include big air, pipe, bumps, freestyle and big mountain skiing.

Remarks: All contestants **MUST** have entry form signed by a parent or legal guardian to compete. Entry forms may be picked up at customer service desk at **King Pine Ski Area** or on line at www.kingpine.com by Sunday morning 1/29/06 and turn at the registration desk in the Fireplace Room at 9:00am. All contestants will have time to inspect the race course at 9:30am and one hour to practice in the park at 12:00-1:00pm before the competition.

Helmet are strongly recommended

Judging: based out of 100%

Jumps and Rails: Time 1:00

Take-off: (how cleanly the athlete leaves the jump or mounts the rail) 20%

Form: (how well the athlete execute the maneuver) 50%

Landing: (how well the athlete comes back to earth) 30%

Half pipe

Execution: (technical & precision of the performance) 20%

Amplitude: (amount and quality of the air above the rim) 20%

Difficulty: (level of difficulty of the tricks) 20%

Overall: (presentation & variety through the entire program) 40%

Due to adverse weather condition we will not have the half pipe part of the competition

Racecourse: Time 10:00

Places by time; (time it takes to complete the course Nastar handicap, fastest time receives the highest score).

Interviews: Time 2:30

Based out of 100%: (5 questions will be asked of each contestant)

Totals

Totals are scores from Jumps and rails, halfpipe, race and interviews added together
